The Pastor's Part



Advent - a time of waiting and anticipation and one of the special seasons of the church. It is a time of preparation for the Christ event each year and for the second coming at the end of the age. Advent is a looking back to the miracle of the incarnation, a celebration of Christ here today and a looking forward to his coming again.

Originally a time of fasting and special devotions leading up to Christmas, the celebration of Advent has been part of much of the larger church for over fifteen hundred years. We celebrate it in most Christian churches by special decorations, special music, and for many, the Advent wreath. Some histories say

the wreath was adopted first by the Roman Catholic Church over a hundred years ago as a symbol of the crown of thorns or Christ's heavenly



crown. There are many different ways the wreath can be configured, but for most of us it is a garland of evergreen branches and five candles.

In most Protestant churches there were four purple candles, one for each Sunday in Advent and central white candle, the Christ candle lit on Christmas Eve. The Roman Catholic church exchanged a pink for one of the purple a century ago. The pink candle, the Gaudete, was from the word rejoice used in the opening of Mass. Many retailers adopted the arrangement of three purple, one pink, and one white, and so many denominations just bought what was offered.

As many of you know I prefer not to use a pink candle since pink has only been a liturgical color for Roman Catholic Cardinals and the Roman Catholic

Advent wreath. I prefer the traditional purplethe symbol of Royalty. Some Protestant churches, including Presbyterian and Methodist, have included blue as an optional color for the candles and the Paraments during Advent. The Lutheran Book of Worship lists blue as the preferred color for Advent as a more hopeful color as opposed to the somber purple of Lent. I think the use of blue for Advent will continue to grow, but I don't think I'm going to get another stole at my age!

What I am sure of is that Advent is a blessed time of anticipation, of encouragement towards deeper faith, to share what we have with othersincluding the meaning of what we celebrate- the coming of the Christ Child and our salvation. And to God be the Glory.

The meeting was called to order at 12:08pm. A quorum was declared present. The moderator opened the meeting with a devotional reading from Isaiah 6 and prayer.

Clerk's Report:

- The Session approved the agenda for this meeting.
- Session approved the minutes from the Stated Meeting of September 22, 2024.
- Session approved removal of Wilda Shover from church roll due to her death, and moving Karen Highlander from the inactive to the active list.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Hannah Bush presented members of Session a Treasurer's Report Year to Date, October 15, 2024. Net income is \$-6,685.22.

<u>Presbytery Meeting:</u> Next meeting will be Nov. 12, 2024.

Old Business:

- Incoming officers were examined. Installation of new officers is scheduled for Sunday January 12, 2025.
- Thanks to Liz Brown and Mike Dundas whose terms are ending, and thanks to Glenn Mader and Randy Moyer for agreeing to work another 3-year term.

Pastor's Report: No report.

Committee Reports:

- Administrative Committee: Sandy handed out a summary of the Hebron Growth Survey sent to chairs of the committees. Sandy would like for all committee reports submitted by January 10, 2025, to Joan Wright for the 2024 Annual Report. Sandy set a deadline of December 1, 2024, to have all committees submit updated responsibilities for the personnel manual.


